

Junaluskans Board Meeting

Harrell Center, Room 102

February 11, 2026

Jan Lemasters called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m.

Present: Margaret Amick, Steve Crites, Jackie Dingus, Frank Dunnewind, Susan Folds, Jan Lemasters, Harold Lein, Cynthia Lindberg, Jeff Mickle, George Shepherd, Lynnette Stewart, Todd Stewart. **Guest:** Ken Howle

Opening Prayer. Jeff Mickle offered an opening prayer.

Approval of minutes. Jeff Mickle reported that the minutes from January 7, 2026, were emailed and no changes were made. Jackie Dingus moved their adoption. George Shepherd seconded. They were adopted.

Treasurer's report. Frank Dunnewind sent report for December 31, 2025: income: \$72,691.81; expenses: \$61,095.55; balance: \$11,596.26. The report for January 31, 2026: income: \$14,271.26; expenses: \$629.14; balance: \$13,642.12 (includes carried forward from last year). He also reported that the Junaluskans have \$15,000 in the Lake's investment account. Ken said that this can be used at our discretion.

Chairpersons.

Membership – Margaret Amick reported that last year at this point, our membership was 197. Right now it is 233. The largest number of responses has come from the notice included with the utility bill. Lynnette Stewart plans to launch a publicity campaign to reach people outside of the Lake about becoming members.

Lake Cleanup – Steve Crites announced that the date is March 7. The lake will be drawn down.

Beautification Day – Ken Howle said that May 13 has been set aside for this purpose.

Swans – Jackie Dingus reported challenges with the lake being frozen, a swan over the dam that took three days to rescue, a swan that ingested two fishing hooks and 50 feet of fishing line, requiring surgery and follow-up care (the bill was \$4000+, which the Assembly will help with). There are seven swans total at this time, including one bonded pair. The seven include one male and six females. There was discussion about people being invited to give to the swan fund. Ken volunteered to meet with Jackie to discuss this further. Lynnette asked for a regular report to be included in Lake Views and News.

Christmas Decorations – Steve Crites and Harold Lein that this is their last season for coordinating.

Travel – George Shepherd said there are no plans at this time.

Frank Dunnewind shared that he will be having knee surgery next week.

Events for 2026

- NOMAD potluck lunch, tentatively on April 7. Rather than make specific plans, Jan will consult with the NOMADS about what they would like to do: lunch potluck or dinner out.
- Flea market on June 13
- Country western event with BBQ dinner on June 16 at York. Lake will furnish the meat, and we will bring the rest. We might want to get some entertainment instead of a DJ and dancing.
- Corn hole tournament on July 3 afternoon on grass by Stuart auditorium. Prizes: gift certificates at Gifts and Grounds. Cleared with Pat McKim. Corn hole game are available from the Lake. Budget to be \$50.
- Presence in Independence Day parade, give out candy to kids.
