#### HAYWOOD CHORAL SOCIETY

### Highlights from the March 2025 Board of Trustees Meeting

The Lake Junaluska Board of Trustees held its biannual meeting on March 6-7, 2025. The following are highlights from the meeting:

Gina Campbell and I provided an update on the Sharing Our Gifts Campaign, which was publicly announced on March 6th at the Annual Donor Banquet. This multi-year campaign focuses on giving to the Annual Fund, capital improvements and legacy (estate) gift commitments. The Board of Trustees established this campaign in 2022 and over the past three years, \$12.3 million has been raised, with a goal of \$14 million by 2027. More information about this exciting campaign is available at lakejunaluska.com/give.

Chuck Lipp delivered the final report on the Dam Preservation and Renewal Task Force's work, emphasizing the dam's critical role in maintaining the lake's operation and supporting the community's well-being. The report stressed the importance of ongoing stewardship to ensure the long-term sustainability of both the dam and the lake.

The Board took the following actions:

- Celebrated the success of the Sharing Our Gifts Campaign and affirmed its public launch on March 6, 2025, with a goal of \$14 million.
- Approved revisions to the Hybrid Work Policy in the Human Resources Manual.
- Authorized a draw of up to \$30,000 from the Bishop Scott Allen Fund for its designated purposes.
- Allocated up to \$200,000 for emergency capital expenditures.
- Approved the use of up to \$25,000 from the Peacock Tennis Court Fund to improve two Lake Junaluska tennis courts, including the addition of pickleball lines.
- Allocated \$10,000 from unrestricted reserve funds to establish a Holston Conference scholarship fund.
- Approved the engagement of Forvis Mazars for the 2024 audit.
- Ratified the Executive and Finance Committees' approval of the 2025 Operating and Public Works budgets.

New trustees elected to the board in October 2024 include Ed LaFountaine for the Class of 2025, and Nathaniel Abrams, Scott Russell, Reed Shirley, and Eric Smith for the Class of 2027.

According to the By-Laws of Lake Junaluska Assembly, Inc., at least 60% of elected trustees must be property owners, with the current board consisting of 83% property owners. For more information about the Board of Trustees, visit https://lakejunaluska.com/vison.
